Resurrection REALity

If Christ remained dead, then the grave is the final, ugly, rotten end of us all. But Christ has indeed been raised. So, Jesus' resurrection proves that "all will be made alive" (1 Corinthians 15:22). The reality of the resurrection does not just change our future, but also the way we look at life now. The a great theologian of long ago, Augustine, called the season of Easter "a joyful week of weeks"— seven wonderful weeks, each seven glorious days long. In this glorious season, let us meditate upon the breath-taking implications of the resurrection.

Our Easter season worship follows this pattern.

Fifth Sunday of Easter 4/28	The Living Lord Produces Active Faith
Sixth Sunday of Easter 5/5	Jesus' Business Is Love; Therefore, So Is Ours
Seventh Sunday of Easter 5/12	We Will Overcome This Hostile World

Theme of the Day - Resurrection REALity: The Living Lord Produces Active Faith

Our actions are largely shaped by our beliefs. People who eat low-carb diets do so, probably not because they hate pasta, but because they believe it is healthy. Christians believe that Christ's resurrection means our resurrection to a glorious eternal life. That simply will show in how we act.

Yet it is not only the facts of the resurrection, or even belief in the resurrection, that shapes our behavior. Jesus Christ has taken up residence in our hearts. In our Gospel reading he likens himself to a vine and us to fruitful branches. How it makes eyes glad to see ripening fruit. Jesus says, "This is what my forgiven, saved people look like. Through me they produce abundant fruit."

FIRST LESSON: Acts 4:32-37

³² The whole group of believers was one in heart and soul. No one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they held everything in common. ³³ The apostles continued to testify about the resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ with great power, and abundant grace was on all of them. ³⁴ There was not a needy person among them. For from time to time those who were owners of lands or houses sold them, brought the

proceeds received from what was sold, ³⁵ and laid it at the apostles' feet. It was distributed to each one according to what anyone needed.

³⁶ Joseph, who was called Barnabas by the apostles (which is translated "son of encouragement"), a Levite, a native of Cyprus, ³⁷ sold a field that belonged to him. He brought the money and laid it at the apostles' feet.



SECOND LESSON: 1 John 3:18-24

¹⁸ Dear children, let us love not only with word or with our tongue, but also in action and truth. ¹⁹ This is how we know that we are of the truth and how we will set our hearts at rest in his presence: ²⁰ If our hearts condemn us, God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. ²¹ Dear friends, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence before God. ²² We also receive from him whatever we ask, because we keep his commands and do what is pleasing in his sight. ²³ This then is his command: that we believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and that we love one another just as he commanded us. ²⁴ The one who keeps his commands remains in God and God in him. This is how we know that he remains in us: We know it from the Spirit, whom he has given to us.

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² Every branch in me that does not bear fruit, he is going to cut off. And he prunes every branch that does bear fruit, so that it will bear more fruit.

³ "You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, and I am going to remain in you. A branch cannot bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Likewise, you cannot bear fruit unless you remain in me.

⁵ "I am the Vine; you are the branches. The one who remains in me and I in him is the one who bears much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. ⁶ If anyone does not remain in me, he is thrown away like a branch and withers. Such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ My Father is glorified by this: that you continue to bear much fruit and prove to be my disciples.
